Eyes in the sky bid to stop illegals

DRONES are being used to stop thousands of migrants sneaking into the UK through the Channel Tunnel.

Eurotunnel bosses are desperate to stem the refugee flow from France where more than 6,000 are camped.

They fear that many migrants may try to find their way into Britain this summer before we leave the EU.

After that the British-French border could become a "huge wall" that would be almost impossible to breach.

Eurotunnel chief Jacques Gounon said: "I'm afraid that we could have an increas-

ed migrant pressure during the summer as a consequence of Brexit.

"Migrants may fear they could be prevented from going to the UK in the years to come."

Drones fitted with security cameras are being used to fly over the border area in an attempt to spot anyone trying to breach security.

But Mr Gounon dismissed calls for border checks to be moved from Calais back to Britain. He said Eurotunnel would not support that.
